Research

Goal

- Develop strategies and methods of unlocking, articulating and sustaining the knowledge that archivists hold about the collections they work with

Objectives

- Conduct literature research and set up a theoretical framework for a qualitative research study of knowledge transfer
- Define the expert knowledge of audiovisual archivists
- Explore the methods of knowledge transfer within audiovisual archives
- Identify the challenges in transferring the expert knowledge of audiovisual archivists
- Formulate and disseminate successful strategies of knowledge transfer for audiovisual archives

- Handbook for knowledge sharing within audiovisual archives
- Symposium

Research step 1

Survey

- April / May 2020
- 135 participants
- Broad and global insight in knowledge at risk, challenges, methods

Research step 2

Qualitative research

- Unexplored theme within the field of audiovisual archiving
- 'Archival ethnography': "a form of naturalistic inquiry which positions the researcher within an archival environment to gain the cultural perspective of those responsible for the creation, collection, care, and use of records."(Karen F. Gracy, 2004)
- Method aims at "**uncovering and collecting data on tacit knowledge, that is, unstated practices and norms shared among community members,**" (Gracy, 2004)

Collecting data

- 92 interviews with colleagues from 25 institutions worldwide
- Interviews provided by archive affiliates
- Interviews done as follow-up with a selection of survey participants who offered concrete knowledge sharing examples or ideas
- Variety: age, position, gender, tenure, nationality, types of institutions, expertise

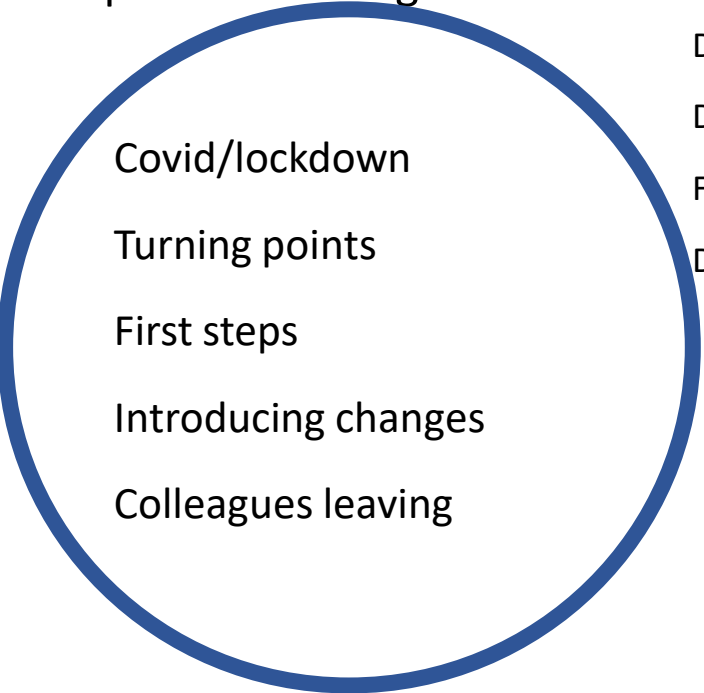

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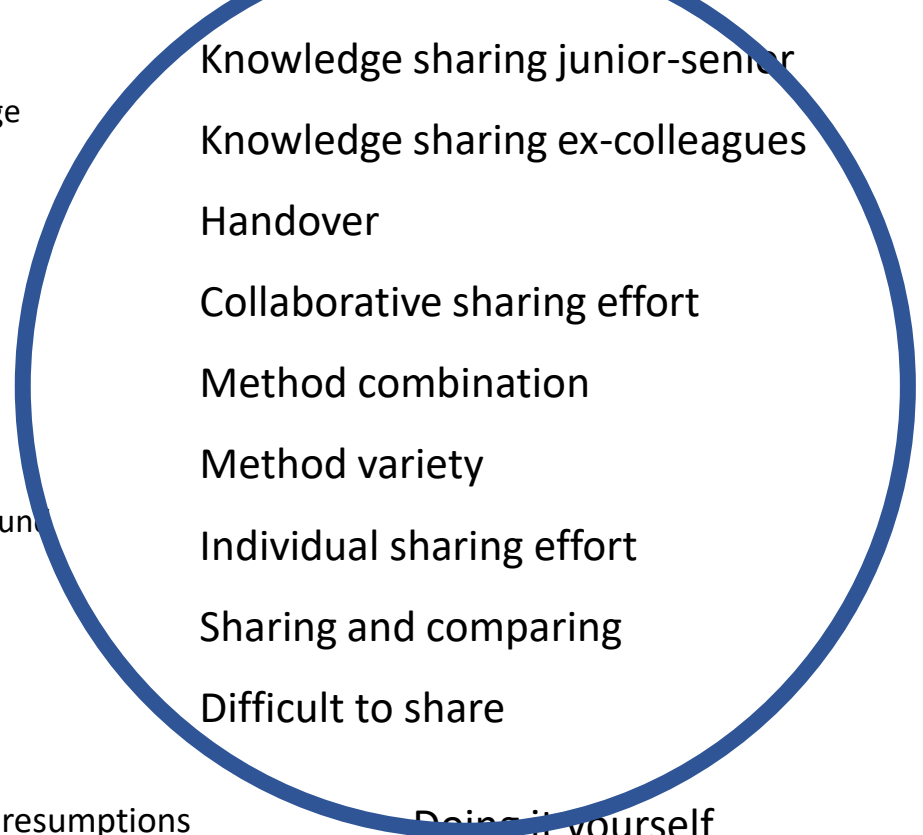
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Final results: beginning 2023
